




Placement Test



Movie

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Reading And Writing

BrainPOP ESL's reading and writing curriculum begins with letter and sound recognition and builds to words and sentence construction in Level 1. Levels 2 and 3 continue with simple paragraphs, and advance to reading and writing multiple-paragraph essays highlighting different text structures, including narrative, persuasive, and informational. Reading passages serve as models for student writing and also assess understanding with questions using context clues, textual evidence, and higher level thinking. Detailed lesson plans and resources accompany every lesson.
